B.S. Multidisciplinary Degree in Anthropology Instructions for preparing your contract.

The B.S. Multidisciplinary Concentration allows you to self-design a concentration that fits your own academic and/or career goals. Courses should be selected from the Undergraduate Bulletin in consultation with your anthropology adviser (note: courses designated as "On Demand" are not regularly offered).

The Department requires this concentration to be both rigorous and coherent. By rigorous, we mean that the concentration should include a majority (at least 60%) of courses at the 3000 and 4000 level. By coherent we mean that the 30 credit hours you select must make sense together as a concentration. In order to ensure coherence, students must submit the following before the concentration will be approved:

- A title for the concentration
- A statement (approximately 250 words in length) that explains the theme of your concentration and notes briefly how your selected courses fit into the theme you are developing.
- A list of the courses you intend to include in your concentration. Courses must be chosen from at least three different departments (may include anthropology). Please note that courses applied to your general education curriculum may also be counted for the multi-disciplinary concentration contract. Students are encouraged to take a foreign language as part of their anthropology education, but only intermediate and advanced language coursework may be applied to the multidisciplinary contract (e.g. SNH 1040, 1050, 1060).

Prepare and print the form prior to your meeting with your anthropology adviser. Your adviser will approve or recommend revisions. Submit the finalized form to your advisor in print form and electronically. All information must be completed prior to obtaining signatures of your adviser and the Department Chair.
